## CHERRY LAUREL Prunus carolinana

Height: $\sim 10-20 \mathrm{ft}$
Conditions: Full to partial sun preferred
Comments: Showy, dense, fast growing evergreen shrub or small tree. Small white seasonal flowers. Requires deep soil and grows 1.5 ft per year.

## EASTERN REDBUD <br> Cercis canadensis var. canadensis

Height: ~20 ft
Conditions: Full to partial sun preferred
Comments: Heart shaped glossy green leaves with vibrant pink to purple flowers in the spring. Flowers bloom early in the spring

Fun Fact: Several parts of the tree are edible

## DWARF POMEGRANATE

 Punica granatum 'nana'Height: ~3 ft

Conditions: Full sun preferred
Comments: Small shrubby tree with
 attractive orange to red flowers that produce miniature pomegranates. Can be grown in a pot just make sure it has drainage.

## Aesculus pavia

Height: $12-15 \mathrm{ft}$
Shade: Full sun to partial shade
Comments:Moderately drought tolerant, this shrubbish tree attracts butterflies and hummingbirds with its tubular red flowers.

Warning: Fruit are not edible for humans

## Magnolia soulageana

Height: $\sim 15-30 \mathrm{ft}$
Conditions: Full sun to partial shade
Comments: Slow growing, multi stemmed tree that has beautiful large pink-purple flowers and is mildly resistant to pollution.
