EASTERN REDBUD

Cercis canadensis

<u>Height</u>: ~10-20 ft

Conditions: Full to partial sun preferred


<u>Comments</u>: Fast growing with heart shaped glossy green leaves with vibrant pink to purple flowers in the spring. Flowers bloom early in the spring. Fast growing but will need supplemental water during droughts.

<u>Fun Fact</u>: The leaves and flowers are important sources for butterflies.

BROWN TURKEY FIG

Ficus carica 'Brown Turkey'

<u>Height</u>: ~10-30 ft

Shade: Full sun preferred

<u>Comments</u>: Self pollinating multi-stemmed woody shrub that produces two rounds of sweet fruit per year. It is also heat tolerant!

<u>Note:</u> Once picked figs stop ripening so make sure the fruit is ready before picking!

COMMON PERSIMMON

Diospyros virginiana

<u>Height</u>: ~15- 30 ft

Conditions: Partial sun

<u>Comments</u>: This is a shrubby adaptable tree, able to survive in various pH and soil moisture regimes and is usually free of diseases and insect problems. Its dioecious meaning a male and female trees are needed for fruit production.The fruit is very sweet and orange.

<u>Fun Facts:</u> This fruit was commonly made into persimmon bread and consumed as dried fruit by indigenous people.

LIVE OAK *Quercus virginiana*

<u>Height</u>: ~50 ft

Conditions: Full sun preferred

<u>Comments</u>: Beautiful and popular shade tree in the Houston area that can live to be 300 years old. Wildlife love this tree!

<u>Fun Fact</u>: This tree is nearly evergreen shedding its leaves for only a few weeks every year
